

5 Must-know CSS Snippets for Divi

1.

Back to Top Button

You can enable the Back to Top button in Divi Theme Options, under the General tab. By default, it doesn't have a very attractive look, but this snippet of code changes its icon, background, color, and box-shadow.

```
.et_pb_scroll_top:before {
    content: '!';
}
.et_pb_scroll_top.et-pb-icon {
    background: #fff;
    color: #000;

    font-size: 22px;
    right: 20px;
    box-shadow: 0 8px 20px rgba(0, 0, 0, 0.15);

2.

Dropdown Menu

The default Divi dropdown menu for desktop uses a lot of padding and can become too narrow if the menu item title is too long. The CSS below stretches the submenu links to full-width and adds a subtle hover effect.

The default Divi navigation:

```
#top-menu ul.sub-menu {
  padding: 10px 0;
}
#top-menu li li {
  padding: 0;
}
#top-menu li li a {
  width:240px;
  transition: all .3s ease-in-out;
}
#top-menu li li a:hover {
  padding-left: 25px;
}
```

The Divi Menu Module:

```
.et-menu-nav>ul.et-menu ul.sub-menu {
  padding: 10px 0;
}
.et-menu li li {
  padding: 0;
}
.et-menu li li a {
  width:240px;
  transition: all .3s ease-in-out;
}
.et-menu li li a:hover {
  padding-left: 25px;
}
```

3.

Mobile Hamburger Icon

This simple bit of code will change the default hamburger icon to a closing X icon when the mobile menu is opened. It works both for the default navigation and the Divi Menu module.

```
.opened .mobile_menu_bar:before {  
  content: '\4d';  
}
```

Animated Toggle Icon

This bit of CSS code will change the icons in Toggles from the plus icon to animated triangles. It will work globally, on all Toggle and Accordion modules across your website.

```
.et_pb_toggle_title:before {  
  content: "\33";  
  transition: all .3s ease-in-out;  
}  
  
.et_pb_toggle_open .et_pb_toggle_title:before {  
  content: "\33";  
  transform: rotate(180deg);  
}
```

5.

Reverse Columns on Mobile

To reverse the order of columns in a Row for tablets and phones, add a CSS class of **dl-reverse-column** to the Row settings and use this bit of CSS code. It will display the right column first, and the left column below on mobile. It also removes the bottom margin from the left column.

```
@media (max-width:980px) {  
  
  .dl-reverse-column {  
    display:flex;  
    flex-direction:column-reverse;  
  }  
  .dl-reverse-column .et_pb_column:first-of-type {  
    margin-bottom:0;  
  }  
  
}
```
